1. Board Meeting and Activities

The Board of Charity Commissioners for Gibraltar ("the Board") met four times during 2024. These meetings served as a platform for discussing various operational and legal matters relating to charity governance in Gibraltar, ensuring continued oversight and efficient management of charity activities.

2. Board Tenure and Re-appointment

The proposed legislation is aimed at modernizing and streamlining the governance of charities in Gibraltar, providing clearer guidelines and more robust frameworks for their operation. This reflects the Board's ongoing commitment to helping improve the charity sector in Gibraltar and ensuring that charities meets contemporary standards of transparency and accountability.
